#### NOTICE

- All stock placed for competition must be the property of the Exhibitor one month before the Show. This rule does not apply to classes marked "Open."
- All stock must be in the Showground no later than 9.00am.
- All stock entered for the Show must stand at their respective posts after judging, and, if not, they will be disqualified. The Society will not be responsible if they miss their class when judging is in progress.
- No substitute of animals in the Hunter and Pony Classes will be permitted unless the Secretary receives written notification of such substitution prior to the day of the Show.
- Exhibitors who possess Height Measurement Certificates in respect of their entries are requested to display them to Stewards or Attending members before entering the judging ring.
- Occasionally classes may coincide. It is up to the competitor to decide which class they will go forward to.
- All Entries in classes governed by Teeth Qualifications to have their Mouths examined before being allowed into the judging ring.
- No stock to be loaded for removal until after the Champion of Champions is over, unless by special permission.
- Any Animal in the Schedule/Catalogue failing to turn out for the Champion of Champions will forfeit the Prize Money.
- All Prize Money must be collected on the day, except for champions/ reserves which will be posted after the show.
- The Committee shall have power on their own initiative to deal with all questions as to the infringement or interpretation of the Rules or Regulations of the Society and their decision shall be final.
- In the event of the Show being cancelled refunds will only be given if request is accompanied by a Stamped Self Addressed envelope and must be received within 14 days of date of show.

An administration fee may be deducted.

- Protests: Protest must be lodged, in writing, with the Secretary on day of the Show, along with a deposit of £20, which will be forfeited if the objection is overruled, and the decision of the Committee in all cases of dispute to be final.
- The Society will not be held responsible for any loss or damage sustained in the Showground.
- We would be obliged if members who have not yet paid their Annual Subscription of £I5 would do so prior to the Show.

#### **RETRAINED RACEHORSE SECTION**

#### BRITISH THOROUGHBRED RETRAINING CENTRE (BTRC) - RETRAINED RACEHORSE

**Class 1** Retrained Racehorse, In-Hand, must hold a Weatherbys passport and to have been in training for minimum of 6 months.

**Class 2** Retrained Racehorse, Ridden, must hold a Weatherbys passport and to have been in training for a minimum of 6 months.

'Blemishes' are ignored as BTRC believes a retrained racehorse should not be marked down for these, it's all about the retrained horse and many ex racehorses are able and proud to continue their new careers with blemishes from racing. Barefoot horses, those only shod up front and those wearing properly fitted hoof boots are also permitted in both classes.

Judging is based not only on the horse but also the partnership between horse and handler/rider and

BTRC encourages grass roots entrants to these classes.

Rosettes will be provided to the best veteran horse (age 16 and over) and best BTRC horse in each class and BTRC merchandise will also be given out to the winners of each class.

Winner of each class will receive a trophy to keep.

Championship. First and Second Prize Winners from Classes 1 and 2 will be eligible

#### **RIDING HORSE SECTION**

(Entries in Hunter Section NOT eligible.) Judging commences immediately after Retrained Racehorse Championship

Class 3 Riding Horse 4 yrs and over

Winner to receive the Pewter Glen Quaich.

#### HUNTER SECTION

Judging commences immediately after Riding horse Class

Class 4 Yearling, 2 + 3yr old likely to make a Hunter/Performance Horse to exceed 153cms/15hh at maturity.

Class 5 Ridden Hunter/Performance Horse, 4 yrs and over.

Championship for Crichton Mains Cup. First and Second Prize Winners from Classes 4 and 5 will be eligible.

Special Rosette for Best Yearling.

#### RIDDEN CLYDESDALE

Judging will commence immediately after the Hunter Championship

Blair Castle Ridden Clydesdale Series: This class is a qualifier for the Ridden Clydesdale Championship to be held at the Defender Blair Castle International Horse Trials 2024. The first two in each class to qualify. Qualification may go down to fourth place, if horses placed 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> have previously qualified. Registered Clydesdales and those eligible for registration may qualify and enter for the Championship.

Class 6 Clydesdale Ridden. 4 years old or over. Rider any age.

#### RING 2

#### **RIDDEN PONIES**

#### Judging commences at 8.45am

**Class 7** Utility Pony not to exceed 148cms/14.2hh, to be ridden by a child not to have attained their 16<sup>th</sup> birthday.

To be judged on turnout and manners. Dalkeith and District Pony Club members please wear red armbands.

Highest placed Rider under 14 to will receive the Klass Cup. Highest placed Dalkeith and District Pony Club member will receive the Cavalier Trophy.

**Class 8** Lead Rein Pony, 4 years and over, not exceeding 122cms/12hh. Riders not to have attained their 9<sup>th</sup> birthday. (to be shown in a snaffle bridle, lead rein to be attached to the noseband)

#### Winner will receive the Lead Rein Trophy.

**Class 9** First Ridden Pony. Not exceeding 122cms/12hh Riders not to have attained their 10<sup>th</sup> birthday. (to be shown in a snaffle bridle only) No cantering allowed except for individual performance.

#### Winner will receive the Airhouse Cup.

#### Mini Championship. First and Second Prize Winners from Classes 8 and 9 will be eligible. Champion £30 Reserve Champion £20 – Kindly Sponsored By D Slight – RP Slight & Sons Ltd

- **Class 10** Ridden Pony, not exceeding 148cms/14.2hh to be ridden by a child not to have attained their 16<sup>th</sup> birthday.
- **Class 11** Ridden Pony, not exceeding 138cms/13.2hh to be ridden by a child not to have attained their 14<sup>th</sup> birthday.
- **Class 12** Ridden Pony, not exceeding 128cms/12.2hh to be ridden by a child not to have attained their 12<sup>th</sup> birthday.

Ridden Pony Championship for the Milday Stud Trophy. First and Second Prize Winners from classes 10-12 will be eligible.

#### D M Webster Trophy to be presented to the Best Rider.

- **Class 14** 4 year old and over, riding pony/hunter pony/performance pony, not exceeding 148cms (14.2hh). (stallions excluded)

Ponies In Hand Championship for 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> prize winners from the above classes 13 & 14.
